Dear Friend of MacArthur Park Lutheran Church and School.

I have now returned from my fourth sabbatical/ study leave and want to thank Pastor Heather, the staff, council, and members of the church for this opportunity to get away for a while for refreshment and education. While I plan to write a number of articles about my sabbatical in upcoming weeks of my blog, in this newsletter article I will tell you some of the things I did. I am still processing all that happened on my sabbatical and in the world over the last two months and will share more at appropriate times.

I began and ended my sabbatical with silent treats at Lebh Shomea, a house of prayer operated by the Oblates of Mary Immaculate in Sarina, Texas about 20 miles south of Kingsville. I used my time at Lebh Shomea in prayer and reflection and found the time in solitude quite beneficial.

My out of state travel took me to the Peace Monastery of Christ in the Desert in the high desert north of Santa Fe, New Mexico. There I stayed at a Benedictine monastery and prayed the hours with the monks for over a week.

My daily schedule was: 2:30 am - get up

4:00 - Vigils

4:45 - Breakfast

5:15 - Lauds

5:45 - Mass,

8:45 – Terce

9:00 – Several Hours of Work

12:45 pm - Sext

1:00 – Main Meal

2:45 - None

5:15 – Matins

5:45 – Dinner

7:20 – Compline, and

7:40 – Lights Out and Grand Silence until Vigils the next

I also went on several tours around San Antonio. Locally I visited the King William District, the Alamo, the Museum Extension of the River Walk, and Market Square.

In the Hill Country, I toured Natural Bridge Caverns, Fredericksburg, the LBJ Ranch, Johnson City, a winery, and Luckenbach.

I spent two Sunday mornings watching the religious programs available locally as well as the Sunday news programs.

On other Sundays I worshiped at Cornerstone Church, Community Bible Church, Concordia Lutheran Church, St. Pius Catho-Church, Northwood Presbyterian Church, and First Unitarian Universalist Church. I also spent two Sundays with my mother and we attended Christ Lutheran Church in Brenham and Holy Cross Lutheran Church in Houston. (Continued on Page 4.)

Congregation Council Meeting Minutes ~ November 15, 2016

In attendance: Beth Borstad, Melissa French-Stephenson, Ellen Bridges, Sheryl Bierstedt, Rene Staul, Pastor Heather Hansen, and guest Dan Bierstedt.

The meeting was called to order at 7:05 PM with devotion by Beth Borstad. The group reaffirmed our commitment to the purpose statement and guiding principles.

Actions:

- The October 18, 2016 minutes were approved with an amendment. There will be a community Thanksgiving service and MPLC will participate. This changed after the October council meeting.
- A written financial report was received from Treasurer Maureen Folkerts. October operating receipts for the church were \$30,877.27 and total expenses were \$29,796.41 with a net income of \$1,080.86. Year to date operating receipts were \$54,927.08 and total expenses were \$61,092.86 with a loss of \$6,165.78. The school had operating receipts of \$28,459.11 and total expenses were \$23,767.54 for a net income of \$4,691.57. Year to date operating receipts were \$78,796.83 and total expenses were \$28,664.59 with a net income of \$50,132.24.
- Pastoral Acts were received with an addition. (Addition) Pastor Paul Ziese presided at the wedding of Renee Staul and Jeremy Edmondson on 10/15/16. Pastor Heather Hansen presided at the memorial service for Marguerite Meinhardt on 10/27/16. Pastor Heather Hansen presided at the memorial service for Helen Louise Wallis (mother of Kathy Jones) on 11/5/16. Tom and Kathy Jones were received into membership by transfer from Prince of Peace Lutheran Church, SA on 11/13/16. Pastor Heather Hansen presided at the Holy Baptism of Micah Theodore Ackerman, son of Korey and Erin Ackerman, on 11/13/16.
- The council approved renewing the Taking Faith Home subscription.

Discussions:

- Congregation Council heard a presentation from Claudia Race on Skyhawks Sports Academy/SuperTots Sports Academy. Sheryl Bierstedt will explore and compile a list of questions for further review.
- Dan Bierstedt, Building Finance Committee, gave an update on his research with regard to the Capital Campaign. He met with a representative from Frost Bank and with Kevin Ott. Beth Borstad will check to see if we have the original plat.
- Pastor Heather had no report.
- Mission Team Reports: Suzette Price is working with volunteers. Renee Edmondson, Sending Chair, will provide a written report. She notes that Diego Bernal will present for the next Texas Treasure Hunt. Sheryl Bierstedt, Inviting Chair, noted that Dale Lockett is working with the Web Site and Maureen Folkerts is working with Facebook. Bill Sweda provided a written report via email after the meeting. 
In addition to the meal, there will be a gift exchange. Each person wishing to participate should bring a wrapped gift with a value less than \$10.


'Ecumenical Witness on the Eve of the Reformation'



What you need:

- Nonstick cooking spray
- 3 cups chocolate chips
- Microwave-safe bowl
- Spoon or spatula
- 2 Tbsp. shortening
- Baking tray lined with wax paper
- Red and green M&M's (or sprinkles)

What you do:

- 1. Lightly spray bowl and wax paper.
- 2. Microwave chocolate chips in bowl for one-minute intervals until chocolate is melted. (Stir after each minute.)
- 3. Stir in shortening. Heat in 10-second intervals, stirring until smooth.
- 4. Pour chocolate onto tray and firmly press in M&M's or sprinkles.
- 5. Refrigerate until firm. Remove bark and break into pieces.


